university real estate development around the globe a concluding chapter by the editors offers practical evaluations of the many cases and identifies best practices in the field

this guide is the result of a un habitat initiative to provide local leaders and decision makers with the tools to support urban planning good practice it includes several how to sections on all aspects of urban planning including how to build resilience and reduce climate risks with an example from sorsogon philippines it outlines practical ways to create and implement a vision for a city that will better prepare it to cope with growth and change the overall guide offers insights from real experiences on what it takes to have an impact and to transform an urban reality through urban planning it clearly links planning and financing and presents many successful practices that emphasize strategies to address real issues it aims to inform leaders about the value that urban planning could bring to their cities and to facili

for much of the twentieth century improvement in the situation of disadvantaged communities was a focus for urban planning and policy yet over the past three decades the ideological triumph of neoliberalism has caused the allocation of spatial political economic and financial resources to favor economic growth at the expense of wider social benefits susan fainstein s concept of the just city encourages planners and policymakers to embrace a different approach to urban development her objective is to combine progressive city planners earlier focus on equity and material well being with considerations of diversity and participation so as to foster a better quality of urban life within the context of a global capitalist political economy fainstein applies theoretical concepts about justice developed by contemporary philosophers to the concrete problems faced by urban planners and policymakers and argues that despite structural obstacles meaningful reform can be achieved at the local level in the first half of the just city fainstein draws on the work of john rawls martha nussbaum iris marion young nancy fraser and others to develop an approach to justice relevant to twenty first century cities one that incorporates three central concepts diversity democracy and equity in the book s second half fainstein tests her ideas through case studies of new york london and amsterdam by evaluating their postwar programs for housing and development in relation to the three norms she concludes by identifying a set of specific criteria for urban planners and policymakers to consider when developing programs to assure greater justice in both the process of their formulation and their effects

questions increasingly dominant urban planning orthodoxies and whether they truly serve everyday city dwellers what makes some cities world class increasingly that designation reflects the use of a toolkit of urban planning practices and policies that circulates around the globe

these strategies establishing creative districts dedicated to technology and design greening the streets reinventing historic districts as tourist draws were deployed to build a globally competitive buenos aires after its devastating 2001 economic crisis in this richly drawn account jacob lederman explores what those efforts teach us about fast evolving changes in city planning practices and why so many local officials chase a nearly identical vision of world class urbanism lederman explores the influence of northern nongovernmental organizations and multilateral agencies on a prominent city of the global south using empirical data keen observations and interviews with people ranging from urban planners to street vendors he explores how transnational best practices actually affect the lives of city dwellers his research also documents the forms of resistance enacted by everyday residents and the tendency of local institutions and social relations to undermine the top down plans of officials most important lederman highlights the paradoxes of world class urbanism for instance while the priorities identified by international agencies are expressed through nonmarket values such as sustainability inclusion and livability local officials often use market centric solutions to pursue them further despite the progressive rhetoric used to describe urban planning goals in most cases their result has been greater social economic and geographic stratification chasing world class urbanism is a much needed guide to the intersections of culture ideology and the realities of twenty first century life in a major latin american city one that illuminates the tension between technocratic aspirations and lived experience

the book s focus on applied urban research would seem to make it particularly useful to nonacademic researchers because it condenses a lot of information into a limited amount of space however the work will benefit from use in a classroom setting where an experienced researcher can elaborate on points made or examples used in the text supplement its contents with material from additional sources and guide students through the exercises suggested at the end of each chapter canadian journal of urban research what is the current spatial form and structure of our urban environment how can we study the factors and forces that account for the specific structure of urban space its social and political processes population distribution and land use addressing these and other important issues gregory d andranovich and gerry riposa highlight specific urban research questions and the ways in which they can be approached by offering a framework for doing urban research covering such topics as how to choose a research design secondary research methods for data collection and how to enhance research utilization the authors demonstrate ways to pair research questions with specific analysis and national level analysis students and researchers in sociology political science psychology public policy and anthropology will find this book a useful guide for planning and executing urban research

going beyond previous investigations into urban land use and travel petter næss presents new research from denmark on residential location

and travel to show how and why urban spatial structures affect people's travel behaviour in a comprehensive case study of the Copenhagen metropolitan area. Næss combines traditional quantitative travel surveys with qualitative interviews in order to identify the more detailed mechanisms through which urban structure affects travel behaviour. The case study findings are compared with those from other Nordic countries and analyzed and evaluated in the light of relevant theory and literature to provide solid, valuable conclusions for planning sustainable urban development with a broader range of statistics than previous studies and conclusions of international relevance. Urban structure matters provides well-grounded conclusions for how spatial planning of urban areas can be used to reduce car dependence and achieve a more sustainable development of cities.

Cities have experienced an unprecedented rate of growth in the last decade. More than half the world's population lives in urban areas, with the U.S. percentage at 80 percent. Cities have captured more than 80 percent of the globe's economic activity and offered social mobility and economic prosperity to millions by clustering creative, innovative, and educated individuals and organizations. Clustering populations, however, can compound both positive and negative conditions, with many modern urban areas experiencing growing inequality, debility, and environmental degradation. The spread and continued growth of urban areas presents a number of concerns for a sustainable future, particularly if cities cannot adequately address the rise of poverty, hunger, resource consumption, and biodiversity loss in their borders. Intended as a comparative illustration of the types of urban sustainability pathways and subsequent lessons learned existing in urban areas, this study examines specific examples that cut across geographies and scales and that feature a range of urban sustainability challenges and opportunities for collaborative learning across metropolitan regions. It focuses on nine cities across the United States and Canada: Los Angeles,

urban public health grapples with the complexity of the urban setting as a physical and social space while also providing an abundance of global and local examples of current urban health practices

an encyclopedia about various topics relating to urban studies

due to climatic social and epidemiological challenges urban areas are suffering from recurring problems that require profound and sustainable solutions although they cover only a small area of the earth s surface metropolises are responsible for most of the world s global carbon emissions which cause adverse effects on energy and the climate this book discusses the spatial development of urban areas in the context of the united nations sustainable development goals chapters address the problems of large urban agglomerations examine their impacts on both people and the environment and propose intervention policies and strategies the book also presents case studies from different areas of the world including chile brazil and india

this publication aims to investigate the nature of social life in public and urban spaces in the cities of the middle east considering the value of environmental approaches it aims to develop a better understanding of the patterns of social interactions and activities in public places which have been influenced by cultural heritage values sustainable and livable open spaces can help in improving living conditions in cities public spaces are relevant as they satisfy many human needs in public spaces people interact and meet people with different cultures and social backgrounds can communicate and learn from each other in social and spontaneous ways however decision makers tend to forget the value of public spaces especially in the absence of a national regulatory framework in emerging globalized cities the book provides a multi disciplinary approach in reading the characteristics and values of public spaces in the emerging cities of the middle east

over the past few decades the developing world has seen unprecedented urban growth and urban areas have had to deal with a number of complex problems as a result while population growth is one of the factors contributing to the deprivation and decay characteristic of most urban areas in the developing world there are other factors apart from demographic and economic factors the political organization factor of centralization has concentrated decision making and with it resources in the urban areas leading to further rural urban migration another factor is one of colonialism the transfer of foreign social structures and technology while offering alternatives has dislocated and significantly altered indigenous patterns of development in the developing world this book examines a region where this last factor is a major significance zambia s copperbelt here the concentration of towns which were developed very rapidly in the 1930s made zambia one of the most highly urbanized

sub saharan countries by focusing on copperbelt towns the book provides a critical analysis of the development of urban policy in zambia aspects of conflict and cooperation between different interest groups and where relevant their economic relationships are explored and a structural conflict model of urban management is proposed the book concludes that with proper management existing and emerging sectional interests in urban areas can help provide conditions which foster the formulation of equitable urban policy although focused on zambia the proposed structural conflict approach has potential for wider application

cities occupy about 3 per cent of the earth s habitable land area and are home to one out of two humans worldwide both estimates are predicted to grow urban space is thus becoming an important novel ecological niche for humans and wildlife alike building on knowledge gathered by urban ecologists during the last half century evidence of evolutionary responses to urbanization has rapidly emerged urban evolutionary biology is a nascent yet fast growing field of research and a fascinating testing ground for evolutionary biologists worldwide urbanization offers a great range of opportunities to examine evolutionary processes because of the radically altered and easily quantifiable urban habitat and the large number of cities worldwide enabling rigorous replicated tests of evolutionary hypotheses urban populations are increasingly exhibiting both neutral and adaptive evolutionary changes at levels ranging from genotypes to phenotypes the novelty of urban evolutionary biology is that these changes are driven by the cities we have built including effects of infrastructure pollution and social characteristics of our urban neighbourhoods it will thereby enrich the field of evolutionary biology with emergent yet incredibly potent new research themes where the urban habitat is key in a series of sixteen chapters written by leading evolutionary biologists working on urban drivers of evolution urban evolutionary biology is the first academic book in the field it synthesizes current knowledge on evolutionary processes occurring literally on our doorstep across the globe and in each city independently provided by publisher
